After forcing his wife to let their mistress move in with them, Holloway passed and forded a career as a lecturer as well as an editor at a time when most women were discouraged from Working. At this time, it was believed that men were the only ones supposed to be working; hence, there was no position for a female in society. The story of The Secrets of a Wonder Woman left many with questions about what it takes for an author to suggest which topic to write about. The author, Jill, had a lot of passion for intelligent women, as well as opiated women who have big dreams and are inspirations to others; however, women who have a legacy have been getting overshadowed by third husbands. In her way, she is trying as much as she can to make women fight for their justice, unlike her counterparts.

The most significant backlash against the excessive use of bondage is said to be tied up and bound in chains mostly on every single page as well as every single issue. The comic became so popular in the United States, and it was only rivalled by Batman as well as Superman in sales, which got recorded overall. Hence, it led to unprecedented prosperity for the Marston in the year 1945, only a few years after Wonder Woman was created. However, in that year, Marston contracted Polio and died, and it was the turn of his wife Holloway to take place, but she was rejected. Instead, Wonder Woman was put under Kaigler, who stripped Wonder Woman of all of her feminist sensibilities and ended up being a helpless, stereotypic woman (Lepore, np).

However, later in the 1970s, Wonder Woman reemerged as one of the cultural icons and a new wave of feminist movements. She was featured in one of the feminist publications, Ms. magazine, which was written with a lot of Wonder Woman adventures and feminist ideas. The legacy of Wonder Woman is seen as up to date, and the impacts are recognized by today's feminists. However, it was kept a secret due to the creator's secret life.
